In order for indoor crop production to become a truly scalable solution, vertical farms need to become more sustainable and cost effective

Utilizes a combination of PV solar panels, lithium ion batteries, and a dispatchable generator outfitted with advanced emissions control technology for cheaper, cleaner and more reliable power

COVID19's Impact on Distributed Energy Financing

Changes

Project finance lenders in 2020 are better capitalized than in 2008

Capital is more scarce, scrutiny is increasing, and cost of capital is higher

As investors become more cautious, they will be more choosey in what projects to finance

For strong balance sheet investors, COVID19 is mostly seen as a short term blip when talking about 20-35 year life assets

How to Adjust

Find a financial partner who understands your projects and knows the real risks

Evaluate credit quality of end users - more important than ever

Bring financial partners into the process early in the developments cycle

Rely on financial partners you trust

- 2. IRS regulations released October 2018, April 2019 and December 2019

Opportunity Zones Basics

- Tax breaks (deferral and exclusion) for equity investments in designated opportunity zones
- Investments must be made through qualified opportunity funds owning qualified opportunity zone property or businesses
- Assets must be tangible property acquired for original use or substantially improved
